Grace Episcopal School

Founded in 1959, Grace Episcopal School has enjoyed a rich history of growth, inclusion and an unmatched commitment by devoted teachers and staff members. These values on which Grace was built remain at the heart of their mission today. Grace is charged by the Vestry of Grace Episcopal Church to serve its community by providing a Christ-centered, co-educational school for children in preschool through grade 5. Grace is a small school by design that aspires to build a strong foundation to prepare students for a lifetime of continued academic, social and emotional success. Grace teaches, and its community members live by, five character keys: honesty, respect, responsibility, courage and compassion. The school enrolls an average of 115 students, with 27% students of color, and is located in the vibrant community of Alexandria, Virginia with a population over 158,000. Their location is in close proximity to the Nation's capital and many national historic and cultural sites. Grace is nationally recognized and accredited by the Virginia Association of Independent Schools (VAIS) and is a member of a variety of educational associations, including VAIS, NAES, NAIS, AISGW, as well as the Virginia Council of Private Education (VCPE).





School Mission

The mission of Grace Episcopal School is to honor the gift of childhood. We accomplish this mission by instilling a passion for learning, teaching the power of goodness, and valuing every individual as a child of God. We are committed to outstanding teachers, small classes and an intentional focus on early and elementary education.



School History

Grace began as a half day preschool program in 1948 for parish children and was held in the basement of Grace Episcopal Church. Father Merrow, the Rector at that time, envisioned an early childhood program that would be an integral part of the parish. With the addition of a parish hall in 1959, Grace Episcopal School was launched, growing to include an elementary school. Today, Grace Episcopal enjoys five acres that includes Merrow Hall, a multi-use facility that provides a place for school assemblies, special programs, indoor play and exercise space, as well as the "Grace Cafe" where students eat lunch together. In addition, the school enjoys well designed outdoor spaces on campus that include a turf athletic field, a basketball court, two playgrounds and an amphitheater, taking full advantage of the exterior space in an urban area.





The Program and Philosophy: A Foundation of Excellence

Grace specializes in the foundational years of children's learning and growth with the joy of childhood at the forefront of the Grace experience

Since its beginning, Grace has thrived as a small independent school by design. Grace provides a strong foundation that prepares students to be lifelong learners by providing a high quality education from Preschool through 5th grade. At Grace, the size and educational philosophy enable teachers to recognize the individual potential of each child, beginning with the youngest learner in the early childhood program.

The school continues to hold high standards for its academic program, maintaining a focus on the individual child and their developmental readiness. Small classes, with an average of 14 students, allow each student to receive personal attention and rich peer interaction both academically and socially.

Differentiation within the classrooms is possible because of the small class sizes, allowing teachers to use a whole child approach and more tailored learning on an individual level. Using the four classroom elements, Content, Strategies, Tools, and Learning Environment teachers are able to provide an individualized approach to learning, meeting students where they are in their academic development.

At the same time, students learn to collaborate with classmates while developing critical thinking skills through research based inquiry. Integrated throughout the classroom and social environment are the **five character keys:** honesty, respect, responsibility, courage, and compassion.

At Grace, students and faculty celebrate and benefit from a diverse population that represents a variety of racial, cultural, ethnic, economic and religious backgrounds.

Grace students happily learn to be innovative thinkers, successful problem solvers and mindful citizens of the global community.




Life in Alexandria




Opportunities, Challenges, and Qualities
